



ROSES

After being informed by the heirloom rose company, where we bought the roses for the Homestead, that we



had to get the roses in the ground as soon as possible, we scrambled to comply; however, we think we've completed it in time for the roses to settle in for the winter.

There are two types: *Gallica officianalis*, which people used to grow for beauty and for the rose hips it created in the fall/winter. The other is *Rosa de Recht*, an old



rose with a lovely scent. They are settling down for the winter right now, but come spring we will be able to enjoy the sublime scent of these roses.
