## SCAN OF THE BUSH-LYON HOMESTEAD

We are VERY excited to announce the Bush-Lyon Homestead will be scanned to create a 360-degree rendering of the Homestead on June 10th! This scan will allow the public to "walk through" the Homestead and learn more about its configuration and current condition. One of the bonuses from this

> will be accurate measurements of the spaces as well as increasing our accessibility. Not only will it save a version of the Homestead in its current condition forever,

but people all over the world will be able to see the design and contents of our historic treasure.

We have therefore been working very hard to clean the Homestead [see the letter about DPW below] and to organize its contents. discovering that we have some wonderful newspapers that no one else seems to have; a long term project will therefore be to digitize them so that everyone can access them. We will be partnering with the Port Chester Rye Brook



Public Library to accomplish this task!

Perhaps unsurprisingly, we have also discovered that we sometimes have 3, 5, or even 10 copies of the same newspaper. While we definitely need to hold on to one copy, we cannot keep all 10 copies. So keep an eye out for a future fundraiser on our part! If you are interested, you might be able to purchase one of the extra nine copies of a 1970s newspaper and own a little piece of Port Chester History!


Dear Editor:

## **Juneteenth Planning Committee**

Have you heard about Juneteenth, our newest national holiday? We celebrate it right here in Port Chester and Rye Brook! Come be a part of our planning and make your imprint on our community!

The Port Chester/Rye Brook Juneteenth Planning Committee seeks students from Port Chester and



Blind Brook High Schools to join the committee. Students will help shape and participate in the local Juneteenth ceremony, and in the process get to know peers from the other high school.

Recent Juneteenth ceremonies have taken place at Lyon Park at the Bush/Lyon Homestead, a historic home that likely had enslaved people living and working there in the 18th century.

The meetings will be facilitated by a coalition of local leaders, including Kikki Short (Port Chester Historical Society), Pastor Jim O'Hanlon (St.

Paul's Church), Rabbi Ben Goldberg (Congregation KTI), Tom Kissner (NAACP) and others. Each meeting will be about an hour.



## **SPRING 2023 LECTURE**

In lieu of the March 2, 2023 meeting, the Port Chester Historical Society held a fascinating lecture featuring Professor Susan Stessin-Cohen, who is the author of the book *In Defiance: Runaways from* 



Slavery in New York's Hudson River Valley 1735-1831. The book is one of the books which the Port Chester Historical Society donated to the Port Chester-Rye Brook Public Library to add to its local history section in celebration of Juneteenth. Approximately 25 people attended the lecture on Zoom. Stessin-Cohn brought a rich understanding of the mechanics of slavery in the North to her materials and managed to bring this part of our history to life for us. It was both informative (we all learned



a lot) and heart-wrenching (the statistics on enslavement are horrifying). Thank you for improving our knowledge so greatly, Susan Stessin-Cohen!

## ANNOTATED HISTORICAL TIMELINE

One of the missions of the Port Chester Historical Society is to educate our community about local history. We have posted a timeline to the website on the local history of the area, starting 11,500 years ago! 
each of the links provided. Much of this history is not well known - there was a LOT going on in our area!

## INTERACTIVE LOCAL HISTORY MAP


